

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Our school term finishes on Friday on a half day. We will finish at 12.30pm and the school will reopen in the New Year on Monday, 08 January 2024.

It has been an action-packed term. Many thanks to Ms. Lillis who got our Facebook, Instagram and X pages up running where you may have seen some snippets of recent activities.

Before the term even began our Parents Association held a very Spooky Disco on <u>Halloween Night</u>. Thanks to Catherine Duffy & Karen Hayes and all members of the Parents Association who organised this fun filled evening which raised €600 for our school.

On 8th of November we had our winter <u>clothes collection</u>, thanks to everyone who donated sacks of recycled clothing.

Also on 8th of November '<u>Cycle Right'</u> lessons commenced for 5th & 6th Class for four weeks. Last year we received a grant for $\leq 10,000$ to construct a shelter for 20 Cycle Spaces under the 'Safe Routes to School' initiative co-ordinated by An Taisce. So, we thought that it would be a great time to offer safe cycling instruction and encourage more cycling to school. We hope to follow this up next year with a <u>'Bring Your Bike'</u> to school day and an organised garda escorted cycle during 'Active Week'.

On Thursday 9th of November pupils from 3rd, 4th & 5th Class were invited to a <u>Circus</u> <u>Workshop in Cloughjordan</u>. The workshops were facilitated by 3 Youth Circus Tutors and the session focused on Hula Hoop tricks, feather balancing, Plate spinning, Saucer manipulation and Skipping rope skills. On Wednesday 15th of November Ms. Byrne attended <u>Tipperary Sports Partnership &</u> <u>Orienteering Ireland training</u> at the CBS in Nenagh. So this is something we hope to introduce next year as orienteering offers a creative and inexpensive activity in schools and is suitable for a range of ages and fitness levels. We would like to congratulate Ms Byrne who has recently been appointed as Assistant Principal II in our School.

On Friday 17th of November our Parents Association held a <u>Table Quiz</u> in Ollie Hayes Bar. The quiz was very well attended and raised over €3,600 for our school. I would like to thank Anne Maxwell and Carmel Gleeson who organised the quiz, raffle & auction and to all the many parents that assisted. Many thanks all those who very generously supported the event by donating and buying items in the Auction. Thanks to Teresa Harney our Quiz Master and Willie Jones our MC on the night.

On Monday 19th of November the children presented over 50 Shoeboxes to the <u>Team</u> <u>Hope Christmas Shoebox Appeal</u>. It was so lovely to see the thought and generosity that went into the donations for each and every box. Many Thanks also to all those who built their own box online.

On Tuesday 21st November our <u>U13 girls won their Cumann na mBunscoil Gaelic Football</u> <u>County Final</u>. It was the first time in 8 years that we had this level of success. On the day we celebrated with a Pizza Party back in the school very kindly donated by our bus driver Jason Ryan from 'Ryan Coaches, Roscrea' and today the girls were presented with their medals by Moneygall All-Star Camogie legend Mary Ryan. Mary also took time today to show pictures and give a very interesting and informative <u>presentation on her recent trip to Kenya in Africa where she & other GPA players fundraised and</u> <u>assisted 'Self Help Africa' in their goal to plant 1 million trees.</u>

On Thursday 23rd November children from <u>Senior Infants received their HSE</u> <u>Vacinations</u>.

Pupils from <u>1st & 2nd Class attended a Blitz in the CBS in Nenagh on Wednesday 29th of November.</u> The group were split into three and played against a variety of teams. Thanks to Cumann na mBunscoil for organising the event and for CBS Transition Year students for refereeing on the day.

In the beginning of December 5th/6th Class began a ten week course of <u>STEAM</u> <u>Engineering in a Box Programme</u>. The programme has a project element, it is very creative the pupils have already created sweet factories, wind turbines and bridges using resources provided by 'STEAM in a Box' and following the fundamentals of engineering.
