Good Afternoon Parents/Guardians,

We finish today at normal time for our Easter Break.

It has been a short but busy term!

This is a synopsis of the main events since Christmas.

- Our Infant Class have had student teacher Ms. Aoife Doughan on placement for the last 5 weeks. They have enjoyed varied lessons covering themes such as the farm, the Garden Centre, Spring and Easter. Thank you, Ms. Tara Mockler, for facilitating Aoife's placement. While Ms. Doughan will be missed in the Infant Room she is not going too far as she will complete her next 5 weeks placement in 1st/2nd Class after Easter.
- World Book Day was celebrated on 02 March. The children all brought their favourite books and took part in Buddy reading of mixed age groups. Recently, Junior Infants have started reading books for the first time by themselves and Senior Infants have read a total of 80 books each since the start of the school year. To celebrate this remarkable achievement, Ms. O'Dowd kindly treated the children to brownies which they happily devoured!

All teams made their project presentation last Friday afternoon to pupils from 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> Class and the winning design team of Anna Costelloe, Maddie Deane, Isabelle Fahy McEvoy, Ruby Lewis, Sarah Chadwick, Ruby Hayes, Aoife Dwyer, Meabh Gleeson and Michelle Larkin were presented with a trophy by Mr. Egan sponsored by Brian Quinlan. A huge Thank You to Brian for his delivery of lessons in this area over this term. The children looked forward to his instruction and encouragement each week. ## After Easter we have a few things on the Calendar that you might note:
